The following crimes were reported in Mt. Airy from January 9 to January 15, 2009.

THEFT FROM AUTO, ATTEMPTED AUTO THEFT

January 9: 1000 block West Hottter St. – Entry gained to 2004 Volvo SW. Items from inside vehicle were scattered around the driveway. Nothing taken. No signs of forced entry.
